In the absence of General Ulio, I am replying further to your recent communication addressed to Major Clark Marshall of this office, and inclosure from Mrs. Ralph B. Little, Aqueduct, Princeton, New Jersey, requesting information relative to her brother, Private Howard E. Barber, who was killed in action on 19 September 1944, the date he had previously been reported missing in action.

An official report has been received from the Commanding General, European Theater of Operations, which reveals that Technician Straight has been interviewed in connection with the information he furnished Private Barber's wife that her husband was a prisoner of war. Technician Straight stated that in his letter to Mrs. Barber he told her not to worry as there was a possibility that her husband might have been captured. At the time this letter was written, Technician Straight had no knowledge that Private Barber had been reported killed in action and it is indeed most unfortunate that the communication in question has caused the family so much confusion and added distress. The information submitted by the Commanding General, European Theater of Operations, also states that an investigation has been made but no record has been found of the receipt of correspondence from Private Barber's family addressed to his former captain and commanding officer. You have my assurance that in the event additional information concerning the circumstances of Private Barber's death are forthcoming, his family will be notified immediately.

It will be of interest and comfort to this bereaved family to know that information is available which discloses that the remains of Private Barber were reverently interred in an overseas cemetery. The Quartermaster General, this city, is concerned with matters of this nature and has been asked to make further direct reply to you.

Dear Sir,

My brother, Pvt. Howard Earl Barber 332249639, Co. C, 33rd Ar. Engr. Batt. c/o Postmaster, New York, New York, A.P.O. 257, was reported missing in action on September 19, 1944. He had been missing three weeks when we were notified.

When he had been missing five month and a few days, we were notified that he had been killed in action on September 19, 1944, the day he was reported missing.

Later my father received a letter that Howard was buried in Eastern France.

To-day I received a letter from my brother's wife and I am quoting part of her letter. "Had another letter from Earl Straight before I wrote him that he heard Howard was taken a prisoner with some more of the boys from the same company".

This Earl Straight was a friend of my brother and was wounded. Later he was sent to an English hospital where I understand he is receiving treatment.

This is the second letter my brother's wife has received containing similar information. The first letter came shortly after he was reported missing.

I have communicated with the Red Cross in Princeton again, and Fort Dix and both are at a loss to understand why news of his death was so long delayed and no explanation offered. Then too why the persistent rumor among his buddies that he was taken a prisoner? How can I obtain the names of some of the men in his company who were taken prisoner? I wrote his Captain and commanding officer shortly after he was reported missing but never received a word in reply.

Will you please try to get me some other word how does one find out where a soldier has been buried over there--eastern France seems a rather indefinite statement to say the least.

Thank you so much for your previous letters.

Dear Mr. Powers:

Recently you wrote to Major Clark Marshall of my office, expressing your interest in securing information in behalf of Mrs. Ralph B. Little, Aqueduct, Princeton, New Jersey, relative to her brother, the late Private Howard E. Berber.

It would be gratifying indeed to be able to encourage Mrs. Little and the other members of the family in their hope that Private Barber still survives. The records show, however, that the official message received from the Commanding General, European Theater of Operations, stated that Private Barber, who was previously reported missing in action in France since 19 September 1944, was killed in action on that date. You have my assurance that our eversees commanders consider all existing factors and no messages of so vital a nature are transmitted unless the evidence is considered to be conclusive. The added distress caused his family by the long delay in reporting his death is of utmost regret to me. Although the theater commanders are fully cognizant of their important responsibility in the prompt and accurate rendition of casualty reports, delays do occasionally occur as a result of the many difficulties involved. Such delays are always deplored and difficult to explain.

I find that no official report has been submitted to indicate that Private Barber was over a prisoner of war, as his wife was advised by Technician Straight. A communication is being sent to the proper military authority requesting that an investigation be initiated, in this respect as well as whether appropriate response has yet been made to the letters Mrs. Little forwarded to her brother's former captain and commanding officer. It might be stated in this connection that upon receipt of an official prisoner of war report, the person named to be notified in case of emergency is informed immediately. You may be certain that when a reply to this inquiry is received, you will be advised without delay.

With reference to the burial of the remains of Private Barber, The Quartermaster General, this city, is concerned with matters of this nature and has been asked to make further direct reply to you.

The wish of Mrs. Little to be furnished the names of some of the men in her brother's former organization who might be prisoners of war is most understandable. I regret, however, that due to the large number of similar requests, the War Department has been obliged to adopt the policy of refraining from making extensive searches required in cases of this nature unless they are directly connected with military necessity. You will, I am sure, realize that to furnish such data to one individual would morally obligate the War Department to take action in all similar cases. Any exception to this policy would subject the War Department to just criticism for having shown preference.

Your attention to the request of Mrs. Little is most considerate and she and the other members of the family have my heartfelt sympathy in their bereavement.

Dear Sir,

My brother, Pvt. Howard Earl Barber #32249639, Co. C, 33rd Ar. Engr. Batt. c/o Postmaster, New York, New York, A.P.O. 257, was reported missing in action on September 19, 1944. He had been missing three weeks when we were notified.

When he had been missing five month and a few days, we were notified that he had been killed in action on September 19, 1944, the day he was reported missing.

Later my father received a letter that Howard was buried in Eastern France.

To-day I received a letter from my brother's wife and I am quoting part of her letter. "Had another letter from Earl Straight before I wrote him that he heard Howard was taken a prisoner with some more of the boys from the same company".

This Earl Straight was a friend of my brother and was wounded. Later he was sent to an English hospital where I understand he is receiving treatment.

This is the second letter my brother's wife has received containing similar information. The first letter came shortly after he was reported missing.

I have communicated withthe Red Cross in Princeton again, and FortDix and both are at a loss to understand why news of his death was so long delayed and no explanation offered. Then too why the persistent rumor among his buddies that he was taken a prisoner? How can I obtain the names of some of the men in his company who were taken prisoner? I wrote his Captain and commanding officer shortly after he was reported missing but never received a word in reply.

Will you please try to get me some other word how does one find out where a soldier has been buried over there-eastern France seems a rather idefinite statement to say the least.

Thank you so much for your previous letters.
