The above named serviceman, my son, was reported "missing in action" as of September 20, 1944. Since then I have had no direct word from him. However, his Captain and another S/Sgt have recently had communications with me. They were both in a German prison camp and from what they saw just before them were taken prisoners and after in the prison camp with the Sther S/Sgt., they are sure my son is dead. According to S/Sgt. Clarkson, he was taken to a prison camp hospital and in justa few hours a German returned and told him he had died.

I am giving the above information, because I am now wondering if by any chance at all there would be any personal effects left. Will you please investigate this and advise me at your very earliest convenience?

I shall await your reply and thank your for your kindness in attending to this.

MEMORANDUM TO: Officer in Charge, Casualty Section, Personnel Actions Branch, AGO

SUBJECT:

Report of Death

- 1. Staff Sergeant Charles W. Shenk, 33154539, Infantry, member of Headquarters Company, 38th Armored Infantry Battalion, was reported missing in action, not in flying or jump pay status, in France on 20 September 1944 by ETO Shipment Number 211 and presumed dead as of 21 September 1945 under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act (SR&D Case No. 4105).
- 2. Staff Sergeant Shenk's Service Record shows that he became missing in action on 20 September 1944 at Sillegny, France. No other particulars concerning his status was found in his Casualty Section or AG 201 files.
- a. On 2 July 1945 this office sent a request to the Commanding General, European Theater of Operations requesting all available information pertaining to Sergeant Shenk. The fifteenth indorsement to the above from Headquarters 38th Armored Infantry Battalion contains the following information:
 - "1. Staff Sergeant Charles W. Shenk accompanied Captain Samuel C. McAdams and Private Mack C. Harris into the town of Sillegny, France to direct artillery and mortar fire against the enemy. Upon entering a small house, Captain McAdams radiced back to this Battalion that enemy tanks (number unknown) were advancing towards the house where these men were sheltered. At that time the radio which Captain McAdams, Private Harris, and Staff Sergeant Shenk were using for communication ceased to function.
 - "2. Due to fact that territory was in enemy hands, a thorough search could not be made. ****
- b. On 17 March 1950 inquiries were sent to Captain Samuel C. McAdams, 039177 and Mr. Mack C. Harris, the persons referred to in paragraph 2a, above, file reference AG 201 Shenk, Charles W., requesting all information relative to Sergeant Shenk. Their statements, dated 29 March 1950, follow:

APR 26 1950

Statement of Captain Samuel C. McAdams, 039177:

- "I. Staff Sergeant Shenk accompanied me into Sillegny, France on the afternoon of 20 September 1944 and was wounded in the legs and back by mortar fire immediately after arrival. He was lying about two (2) feet away from me when wounded. I moved him into a house and he was given first aid by a Medical Enlisted man. Several other men who had been wounded were also kept in the house as only one first aid man was with this group. It was impossible to evacuate these wounded to the rear as we were cut-off by enemy tanks and ground troops.
- "2. Then I surrendered about 0100 hours on the morning of the 21st of September I told the Germans about the wounded and asked them to let me go into the house to help them get the wounded out. Sergeant Shenk was still alive at the time because I had talked to him a few minutes before we were captured, he had been given morphine for his pain and was placed on a door so that he could be moved easily. The Germans would not let me go with them to help with the wounded, but told me they would be taken care of. I never saw Sergeant Shenk again.
- "3. We were moved to a small village about three (3) miles away and kept in a cellar for the remaining part of the night, early the next morning we started our march to the rear and I again asked a German non-commissioned officer if they evacuated the wounded and he told me they had.
- "4. Sometime during the month of April 1945 while in a prison camp in Luckenwalde, Germany I met Sergeant Milan Clarkston, whose address is Box 1, Wadley, Georgia or 711 Columbia Street, Elmira, New York. Sergeant Clarkston was a member of my Company and was captured with me on the morning of the 21st of September. He told me that while in a German prison one of the Germans who had captured us recognized him and told him that the man we had on the door died. Sergeant Shenk was the only man, to the best of my knowledge, that had been placed on a door to be moved.
- "5. It is my opinion that Sergeant Shenk was evacuated to a German Hospital and later died."

AG 201 Shenk, Charles W. 33154539 (18 Apr 50)

Statement of Private Mack C. Harris, 34254349:

"In regard to your letter concerning S/Sgt Charles N. Shenk.

"On this date Sept. 20 - 1944 Capt. MoAdams S/Sgt Shonk and myself were directing artillery & mortar fire on Silleny. France. Capt. McAdams was inside the house, useing the radio trying to contact help or aid, (Major Wells of 38 Armd. Inf. Bn.) (S/Sgt Shenk) (1st Lt. White, & a Sgt I never knew out of an Engineer outfit) were at the back of the house, I was at the side of the house, an enemy mortar shell hit the wall just over the heads of these men. Major Wells of 38 Armd. Inf. Bn. Eq was killed out right - 1st Lt. White & the Sgt. out of the Engineer outfit were also killed, S/Sgt Shenk was badly wounded, he was hit in the lower part of the body, the groin & stomache, the wounds were severly. I helped to get him into the house, there was a medical aid man there but he had very limited sipplies. He did the best he could for S/Sgt Shenk in the way of aid - this was between 4 & 6 oclock in the evening. S/Sgt. Shenk was delerious. We did every thing possible to make him comfortable. So the Germans marched in on us some time between 1100 & 200 oclock. We took down a door for a stretcher & took Sgt Shenk with us.

"The Germans marched the groupe for about 3 hours - about 8 or 9 miles, we finally were herded in to a barn, there was a German Dr. he was asking if any one was wounded. Several of the boys and my self had minor wounds, we took Sgt Shenk in a small room and the Dr. sent the rest of us up stairs, in about an hour they called the groupe together again to continue our treak into Germany. So we called for S/Sgt Shenk. The Dr. said he had passed away. So we had to leave him there - I am sure all of his papers & pay book & dog tags were on him -

"I have never spoke of this before to any one, I had presumed the Germans had notified the U. S. Government. ***

- 3. The captured German records contain no information relative to Sergeant Shenk, nor do the files of the Memorial Division, Office of the Quartermaster General contain any burial information, at the present, on Sergeant Shenk.
- 4. The subject person accompanied Captain Samuel C. McAdams and Private Mack C. Harris, all of Headquarters Company 38th Armored Infantry Battalion,

into Sillegny, France on the afternoon of 20 September 1944. They were to direct artillery and mortar fire against the enemy. Soon after their arrival at Sillegny, sometime between 1600 and 1800 hours, Sergeant Shenk was seriously wounded in the stomach, groin and legs by enemy mortar fire. He was moved into a house and given first aid by a Medical enlisted man. It was impossible to evacuate Sergeant Shenk as their position was cut off by enemy tanks and ground troops. Sillegny fell into the hands of the enemy. They were captured by the Germans about 0100 hours on the morning of 21 September 1944. The Germans ordered their evacuation to the rear. Sergeant Shenk was placed on a door so that he could be moved more easily and they marched to a small village (name not known) about three miles from Sillegny according to the statement of Captain McAdams, although Private Harris stated that the Germans "marched the groupe for about 3 hours - about 8 or 9 miles." According to Private Marris' statement they were at this place for about one hour when they were called again to continue their march. When they inquired about Sergeant Shenk a German doctor told them he died. Captain McAdams stated that while he was a prisoner of war he met Sergeant Milan Clarkston of his Company, who was captured at the same time. Sergeant Clarkston told him that one of his captors told him "that the man on the door died." Nothing has been seen or heard of Sergeant Shenk since. The captured German records reveal no trace of him. Considering the above facts and the lapse of time it is reasonable to believe that Sergeant Shenk died of wounds received in action, sometime between 0400 and 0600 hours on 21 September 1944 near Sillegny, France.

5. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death stating that the person named in paragraph one, above, Infantry, died of wounds received in action, not in flying or jump status, sometime between 0400 and 0600 hours on 21 September 1944 near Sillegny, France. The official report of death will include the following statement:

"Finding of Death has been issued previously under Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, showing presumed date of death as 21 September 1945. This 'Report

The entire area in the vicinity of the town of SILLEGNY is under cultivation and much reconstruction work has been done in the town itself including the building of a new road through the center of the town without disclosing the presence of additional remains.

IV. CONCLUSION

The area indicated in this case has been thoroughly investigated. Demining and salvage operations failed to reveal any trace of additional remains. The village of SILLEGNY was almost completely destroyed, and consequently extensive rebuilding and construction work has been done in the area without additional remains being discovered.

V. RECOMMENDATION

That records be checked in an effort to determine the disposition of the remains listed in an unknown status on copy of Area Search Certificate No 1, undated, and Notice of Disinterment, dated 28 May 1946 (No 4) supposedly taken to U. S. Military Cemetery at GEREMSHEIM.

I. AUTHORITY AND MATTERS INVESTIGATED:

In compliance with Investigation Directive # 225, dated 18
April 1950, an investigation was conducted in the vicinity of SILLEGNY
(B-9/4-84) France, in an effort to recover the remains of the following listed casualties:

SHENK, Charles W. S/Sgt. 33 154 539
WELLS, Thomas H. Maj. 0 392 480

II. FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES:

The above listed casualties were members of the 38th Armd. Inf. Bn. engaged in action against the enemy in a wooded area west of SILLEGNY, France. Heavy armored resistance caused the Battalion to withdraw and when the withdrawal had been accomplished, it was found that Major Wells had not succeeded in returning with his unit. S/Sgt Shenk was last seen as he left with his company to enter SILLEGNY. Upon entering SILLEGNY, S/Sgt Shenk was among a group of men who were cut off from the unit by enemy tanks. He did not succeed in rejoining his company.

III. FINDINGS:

was made with the Mayor Mr. Mathis. He stated that all remains, both American and German, which had been recovered from the territory of this community, had been evacuated by ACRC units (See Inclosure #1). He further produced area Search Certificates and Notices of Disinterment, which indicate that eleven (11) American, forty-one (41) German, and five (5) unknown remains were taken from SILLEGNY in April and May 1946. Copies of these records were made and are attached as part of this investigation (See Inclosure #2). The Mayor also stated that the area has been completely demined, and that all wrecked tanks and vehicles have been removed from the area. He was never informed of the finding of any additional remains during this operation. An extensive search was next made
