Upon arrival at Northwestern station, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, 1450, 15 February 1949 I was met by Mr. William Janssen and one son, Funeral Directors. At that time I was not aware of any friction. Mr. Janssen Stated, "I did not bring a hearse, I brought a panel truck. (This vehicle had been made to appear somewhat like a hearse.) You can go now, there is no room for you to ride with me to the Funeral Home. If you want to come out to the Funeral Home take a taxi."

I said, "I will stay with the remains until I get the receipt. I will not leave here until I see the Next-of-Kin."

Upon loading the remains the casket was in such a position that it would have to travel head first if loaded directly into the hearse. When they began to load, with my help, I said, "Feet First, please."

He Said, "It doesn't make any difference."

I repeated my statement, "Feet first, please."

Then one of the railroad men who was helping to load said, "That's right--feet first." The funeral director then proceeded to load the remains feet first.

I checked in my suitcase at the Railroad station after suggesting that the Funeral Director wait for me.

I accompanied the remains, in the hearse, to the Funeral Home. The son had to squat between the seats and the casket.

The Funeral Director then informed me that the Next-of-Kin lived in Hale's Corners, Wisconsin -- the remains would be left at the Funeral Home in Milwaukee. He also said that the Next-of-Kin would be in Milwaukee at the funeral home on Friday evening, 18 February.

Although the Funeral Director lived at Hale's Corners he did not suggest that I might be able to ride to the town, so I decided that I would meet the Next-of-Kin on my own.

After arrival at the Funeral Home, the Funeral Director and his son proceeded to remove the shipping case from the casket. They let one end of the casket rest on the ground and the other end to remain in the hearse while they removed the retaining bolts. This definitely could be seen from the street. I did not say anything more because of the lack of cooperation which I had received up to this time and because I felt it best not to press the issue to too great an extent.

After placing the remains in the funeral home the flag still was folded on the casket as in shipment. He insisted that I leave it that way until the proper time to lay the remains in state. I did not protest.

He then signed my receipt of remains -- I asked for a paper in which to wrap the shipping flag and received it. He then ushered me out of the Funeral Home with great haste.

The following day, Wednesday, I traveled to Hale's Corners at my own expense by Interurban train. Upon arrival at Hale's Corners I inquired as to where to find the Next-of-Kin. I found the family name and telephone listed in the telephone directory. The Mother informed me by telephone as to where the home was located. I walked over three miles to the home. The Next-of-Kin received me very well. I explained my business. Knowing that the funeral would be several hours over the time limit I informed them that I thought I could remain but that I would call the Distribution Center. I called the Distribution Center on Thursday at 0900 hours and received verbal authority from M/Sgt Cunningham to remain for the extra few hours.

Friday afternoon at about 1600 I arrived at the Funeral Home -- was received in a cold manner and was told by the Funeral Director's son to return after 1800 hours.

I met the other son of the Funeral Director on the street and asked for a few words with him. I asked why the Escort was given such a cold reception? He informed me that the Funeral Home and its employees were under no obligation to "you Escorts -- we don't want you to come here and tell us how to run our business." I asked if I was telling him how to run his business? He said "No" but implied that he felt that it would be expected from me. My assumption was that the checks which the Escorts made regarding first movement of the remains, placing flowers on the flag, etc. were intended to be as "telling him how to run his business." He did not directly say this. He said that he handled the contract funeral work for the Soldiers' Home and for the Veterans' Administration. He also said that they had been in business for over 40 years and they were not going to have anyone who had seen a few funerals trying to take over.

Friday evening I arrived at the Funeral Home about 2000 hours, met the Next-of-Kin again, spoke with different members of the family, and was received very well. The Funeral Director's son, who manages the funeral home in Milwaukee, was very friendly while in the presence of the Next-of-Kin. I departed soon after 2100 hours.

Saturday I reported to the Funeral Home between 0730 and 0745 hours and was informed that I would ride in the funeral coach. Upon arrival of the American Legion I turned over my ammunition to the Commander and was very well received by the Legion members.

On the way to the Church, which was at St. Martin's, Wisconsin, the flag slid off the casket. I did not try to replace it then, because of the lack of space in the hearse and the driver's insistence that I leave it until arrival at the Church. At the Church the Funeral Director and I re-draped the flag while the Pall Bearers held the casket. After moving the casket into the Church a Crucifix was stood on the flag. Again I did not say anything because I did not wish to create any confusion in the Church. However, one of the Legion members mentioned the error to a son of the Funeral Director at the cemetery. I then stepped forward and verified the statement.

The Funeral Director offered me a ride from the cemetery to Milwaukee. I informed him that transportation only to Hale's Corners would be sufficient, however, some of the Legion members gave me a ride through to Milwaukee.

The reason that I did not ride with the Funeral Director was to eliminate any more friction.

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1. When the remains are delivered for interment in a civilian or private cemetery, you are responsible for paying all interment expenses. In this connection, you are entitled to the allowance mentioned in paragraph 2 below.

2. An amount not to exceed \$75 is allowed by the Government toward actual interment expenses when final interment of the remains is in a private or civilian cemetery. No allowance is authorized toward interment expenses when interment is in a national or post cemetery.

3. The \$75 maximum allowance by the Government toward interment expenses includes but is not limited to the payment of one or more of the following items: Hearse hire from the railroad station to your home, the funeral home, church, cemetery, or any other place designated by you; vault; church services; newspaper notices; transportation for friends and relatives to and from cemetery; and the services of a funeral director.

4. Reimbursement by the Government is made only to the person who paid from his personal funds the expenses of or incident to interment in a private or civilian cemetery. Receipted bills are not required to accompany this form. Any expenses over and above the \$75 maximum must be borne by the person who incurred or paid the additional expenses.

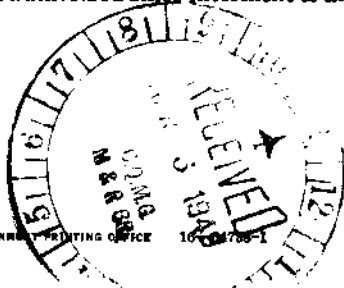

When the remains are delivered to you at Government expense prior to burial in a national or post cemetery, you are responsible for all additional expenses necessary to deliver the remains from that point to the national or post cemetery grave site. However, you may be entitled to an allowance for the cost of transporting the remains from your home to the national or post cemetery grave site subject to the conditions outlined in paragraph 2 below.

2. Reimbursement of transportation expenses is allowed only when the cost to the Government to deliver the remains to you is LESS than what it would have cost the Government to deliver the remains direct to the national or post cemetery of final interment. However, the amount which you may be allowed (the difference between cost of delivery to you and cost of delivery by the Government direct to the national or post cemetery) may not exceed the amount actually expended by you to deliver the remains to the cemetery grave site. **WHETHER OR NOT YOU WILL BE GRANTED AN ALLOWANCE IS DEPENDENT UPON AN AUDIT OF THIS REQUEST. IN ANY EVENT YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED OF ANY ALLOWANCE DUE YOU BY THE OFFICE TO WHICH THIS FORM IS SENT.**

3. Reimbursement by the Government will be made only to the person who paid from his personal funds for transporting the remains to the national or post cemetery grave site.

4. No interment expense allowance is authorized since interment is made ultimately in a national or post cemetery.

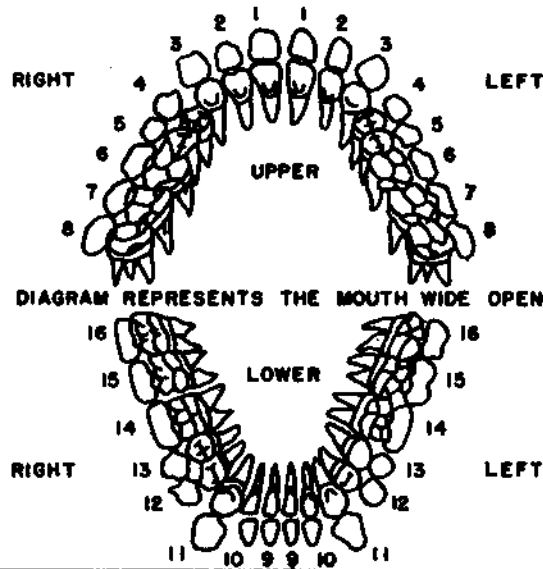


DIAGRAM REPRESENTS THE MOUTH WIDE OPEN

1. Report of Summary Court appointed under the provisions of AW 112 by Special Orders No. 37, Headquarters 123d Field Artillery Battalion, dated 14 July 1945 (See Exhibit "A") for the purpose of processing the effects of Private First Class Francis L. Bosch, 36 270 615, and covering all actions taken by the Summary Court in accordance with AW 112 and current War Department Regulations is herewith submitted.
2. The report to the War Department of circumstances surrounding the death of Private First Class Bosch stated: "Death by accidental drowning in the Naguilian River near Naguilian, La Union, Luzon, Philippine Islands on 13 July 1945".
3. The beneficiary of the deceased as stated in available records is Mrs. Clara Bosch, mother, residing at Route #2, Box 73, Caledonia, Wisconsin.
4. Disposition of effects of the deceased has been made as follows:
  - a. All personal effects of the deceased other than financial known to exist have been collected, cleaned and inventoried and securely packed with a copy of the inventory inclosed.
  - b. All organizational clothing and equipment have been removed from the effects and turned over to 1st Lt Walter V. McGill, Battery Commander, Battery "A" 123d FA Bn.
  - c. Financial effects:
    - (1) All cash found among the effects, totaling six dollars and eighty cents (\$6.80) has been turned over to Captain Harry E. Baylor, Jr, FD, Finance Officer, 33d Infantry Division, on 20 July 1945 and converted by Captain Baylor to a treasury check No. 16,733, dated 20 July 1945, amounting to six dollars and eighty cents (\$6.80) and drawn to the order of the Effects Quartermaster Trustee.
    - (2) There is no evidence of a bank account in Australia.
    - (3) There were no outstanding debts.
    - (4) All commercial paper, including the treasury check representing cash found among the effects, and copy of inventory have been forwarded direct by air mail to the Effects Quartermaster, Army Effects Bureau, Depot, Kansas City, Missouri, with letter of transmittal.


d. The inventory has been checked against the personal effects before sealing the package and was found to be correct.

f. The package has been addressed to the Effects Quartermaster, Army Effects Bureau, QM Depot, Kansas City, Missouri., and shipped through Base "M" Effects Quartermaster, APO 70.

g. A copy of this final report has been sent direct to the Effects Quartermaster, Kansas City, Missouri.

h. A copy of this final report has been filed in the records of the 123d FA Bn.
