



SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground or air operations in the department of Moselle, France, from the period 5 September 1944 to 16 March 1945. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigation have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Moselle have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Moselle department, for the most part, consists of farm, pasture and forested areas which has been under constant cultivation and supervision by farmers and forest guards, since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide



Reference is again made to your letter addressed to The Adjutant General, Washington, D. C., requesting additional information concerning the death of your brother.

Your desire to be fully informed regarding the death of your brother, Private First Class John Ponsone, Army serial number 34 192 303, Infantry, is most understandable. The casualty message received from the Commanding General of the European Theater of Operations stated only that he was killed in action 10 September 1944 in France, the same day he was previously reported missing. Additional information has now been received which shows that at the time he became missing he was in the vicinity of Dornot, France, but unfortunately no further details regarding his death, or the specific cause, were given. I am sure you will appreciate how the conditions under which our military forces operated made it extremely difficult to record all details concerning casualties.

With reference to your statement, a report from your brother's organization shows that on 10 September 1944 his company engaged the enemy in the vicinity of Dornot, France and fought all day on the same ground until 9:00 p.m., when they were ordered to withdraw from their position. Casualties were high and loss of equipment heavy when our men were forced to swim the river under fire.

The Quartermaster General of the Army, Washington 25, D. C., has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to the burial of our military personnel who die overseas. A copy of your letter has accordingly been forwarded to that officer for necessary action.
