D.

No difficulty was experienced with Mrs. Bossman. I explained in the beginning to Mrs. Bossman that it was a difficult case and asked if I could exercise my own judgment, and hold back some of the details. She asked not to tell her any gruesome details.

The discrepancy was explained about how the remains of her husband had been included in the group. She was told that during the confusion of combat, his remains were buried in the cemetery at Epernay, along side the casualties of the tank. Upon exhumation for transfer to a military cemetery they were thought to be part of the tank crew. Mrs. Bossman accepted the decision and was very thankful for the visit.

SECTION IV - ACTION

Action recommended - the following recommendations are made:

- 1. That all records in this Office, and at Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery be amended to show this as a group of four decedents, adding Captain Bossman's name to the group.
- 2. That a new marker be erected bearing the four names of the group as now constituted.
- 3. That a letter be dispatched to Mrs. Bossman confirming this visit and informing her of the grave location.
 - 4. That a Memorial flag be dispatched to Mrs. Bossman.

5. That a photostat of this report be crossfiled into each of the 293 files of the group.

Mr. John Ensminger, the father wasn't home. He is a railroad man, and was away on a rail run. Mrs. Ensminger, the decedent's stepmother, said she could deliver any message I would leave. I found that the family felt very kindly toward the Army. Mrs. Ensminger said that they didn't write much because the Army had kept them so well informed.

The case was carefully explained. I told the mother that this Office was positive that Captain Bossman's remains were included in the group. Ers. Ensminger wasn't surprised and thanked me for the visit and information.

Mrs. Ensminger was informed that Captain Bossman's name would be inscribed on the headstone and that the group now would be a group of four.

On 27 October 1951, I arrived in Hamburg, Arkansas, to confer with the next of kin of Private John F. Tucker, 38516495. Mr. and Mrs. Frank Tucker, Parents, and Peggy Tucker, daughter of the decedent met with me.

I found Mr. and Mrs. Tucker very pleasant and receptive to the situation. The case was carefully explained. They were told that the remains of Captain Bossman were included in the group and that this was not known until a thorough investigation was made in an attempt to account for Captain Bossman. The parents were very pleased that I made this visit to them to explain. The mother said, "I know I wouldn't have understood if you had written a letter."

C.

On 30 October 1951, I arrived in Stockton, California, to interview Mr. and Mrs. Shaljian, Parents of Second Lieutenant Donald J. Shaljian, 01017063. The parents were found to be very pleasant, and receptive to narrative of this case.

All details were explained to them. They were told that after exhaustive investigation, it was concluded that the remains of Captain Bossman had
been included with those of the group. Further, that it was the decision of
this Office to add the name of Captain Bossman to the marker.

The parents fully understood. There were no recrimminations or harsh remarks. On the contrary, the father expressed thanks for my visit and stated that when they were present at the interment ceremony his feeling was one of detachment. He couldn't believe that his son was in the group. However, now he felt different he said, "your visit has cleared everything, I now know that my son is in that group, and I'm amazed by the thoroughness of the investigation, and the thoughtfulness of the personal visit." He further stated that a letter would not have been satisfactory in explanation.

Your recent letter concerning final interment of the remains of the group including your son, the late Second Lieutenant Donald J. Shaljian, has come to my attention.

I fully appreciate your desire to have the remains of your son and those of his crew members interred in the Arlington Mational Cemetery, Fort Myer, Virginia, rather than in the Jefferson Barracks Mational Cemetery, St. Louis, Missouri. I must inform you, however, that in cases of group burials, a change can be made in the designated national cometery only upon unanimous consent of all next of kin involved, and since this office has not received requests for interment in the Arlington National Cemetery from the next of kin of all decedents in the group. I regret that we cannot comply with your wishes in the matter.

Should the next of kin concerned write to this office voluntarily requesting that final burial be made in the Arlington National Cemetery, you may be assured that we will attempt to comply with their mutual desires, if final interment has not already been accomplished. The Department of the Army desires that you be given the most recent information concerning your son, the late Second Lieutenant Donald J. Shaljian, ASN 01 017 063.

The American Graves Registration Service in their search for deceased American personnel recovered certain remains from the area in which your son and others of his comrades met their death. As identifications could not be established at the time of the recovery, unknown designations were assigned pending further investigation, and temporary interments were made in a United States Military Cemetery overseas.

The investigation has now been completed, and although the circumstances rendered individual identifications impossible, sufficient evidence was present to determine that they were those of your son and two comrades and to warrant a group identification of the remains. The remains are now casketed, and being held overseas, pending return to the United States for interment in Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery, located at Saint Louis 23, Missouri.

This plan for the burial in one of our country's shrines of all the known groups of men for whom individual identity cannot be established, is based upon the provisions of Public Iaw 383, 79th Congress, as amended by Section 3, Public Iaw 368, 80th Congress. Final interment in a national cemetery in the United States where perpetual care will be given the graves, is fitting and proper. This particular national cemetery was selected in order that no undue burden of travel might be placed on any one family wishing to attend the services.

You and the pert of kin of the other men will be informed of the date and time of final interment sufficiently in advance to permit you and any interested persons to attend the ceremonies. In order that you may receive information concerning these final rites, it is essential, in case you change your address, that you promptly inform the Commanding General, New York Fort of Embarkation, Attention ACRD, First Avenue and 58th Street, Brecklyn 20, New York.



Dear Mr. Shaljien:

I have received an inquiry in your behalf from the Honorable Leroy Johnson, Representative in Congress, 302 City Hall, Stockton, California, concerning your son, the late Second Lieutenant Donald J. Shaljian.

I sympathize with you in your desire for all available details regarding the status of your son. The reports submitted to the War Department disclose that Lieutenant Shaljian, a member of Company C, 31st Tank Battalion, 7th Armored Division, was one of five crew members of a tank which was leading a platoon of tanks on 28 August 1944, in an assualt on Epernay, France, which is located about 17 miles south of Reims, France. Lieutenant Shaljian and two of the other man were reported missing in action when their tank was hit by enemy fire, exploded and burned. Two of the crew evacuated the tank when it was struck, one of these men being captured by the Germans and later reported as a prisoner of war. The second man evaded capture and returned to duty with his company. Unfortunately he was unable to furnish any information as to the status of the other crew members, two of whom were found in the tank but due to the circumstances under which they died it was not possible to make positive identification.

At the time Lieutenant Shaljian was reported missing in action, the information available warranted some hope for his survival, but after the lapse of many months, these circumstances lost their significance when considered with all other relevant factors bearing on his absence. Therefore, an official finding of death was issued in his case pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, as amended. In considering any case under this law, the Wer Department does not deem it sound policy to make a finding of death while any reasonable ground remains for presuming that the person in question might still be alive.

The records show that the commanding officer of Company C, 31st Tank Battalion at the time of Lieutenant Shaljian's death was First Lieutenant George J. Racine, 01013889. He has been relieved from active duty and his home address is recorded as Orient Heights, Danielson, Commecticut.

His parents would like to know something about their son, namely, what Army unit he was a member of, including the details, such as platoon, battalion, division, etc., who his commanding officer was, such as the commanding officer of his battalion; have all efforts to locate his body failed; and is the Army satisfied that he is actually dead.




