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

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground operations in the department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, France, from the period 7 Septembor through 3 December 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Meurthe-et-Moselle department, consists of farm, pasture and forest land which has been under constant use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification, with the exception of two men listed on attached roster who were known to have drowned and their remains never recovered. MEMORANDUM TO: Officer in Charge, Casualty Section, Personnel Actions Branch, AGO

SUBJECT: Report of Death

1. The following persons, Infantry, members of Company C, 40th Tank Battalion were reported missing in action, not in flying or jump pay status, in France on 9 September 1944 by ETO Shipment Number 196 and presumed dead as of 10 September 1945 under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act (SR&D Case Number 4036):

2. A Missing Report, dated 10 September 1944, filed in the AG 201 file of Sergeant Bryan contains the following information:

Mission: "To destroy enemy and gun emplacements." Point of Departure: "3 Miles S.W. Malancourt". Date: "9 Sep 1944." Intended Destination: "Mannville, France." Last Known Whereabouts: "Near Mannville, France." Circumstances Surrounding Disappearance: "In attacking, the tank in which the above man was riding, was hit by enemy fire and burned. He has not shown up or been reported by any Med Aid Station."

The report further shows that there were no eyewitnesses and search was not made as territory was in enemy hands.

a. Similar Missing Reports are filed in the AG 201 and Casualty Section files of the other four members of the subject tank crew.

b. A "Certificate" of search, dated 16 September 1944, signed by 1st Lt Hilton J. Dentser, Company C, 40th Tank Battalion, found in Sergeant Jack H. Lewis' Casualty Section file, certifies that information received from persons "in the vicinity where the above soldier was missing in action makes me believe his personal effects were destroyed by fire or captured by the enemy."

c. Copy of a letter, dated 23 April 1945, from Captain/Robert M. Rutan, Chaplain, 40th Tank Battalion, to Mr. Jim Wallace, brother of Private First Class Florian Wallace, one of the subject persons, found in his Casualty Section file shows that:

"During the bitter fighting in the vicinity of Metz, France, your brother's tank was disabled while in action. Florian did prot 4 1950 appear with the other members of his company and was listed as missaing in action on the 9th of September, 1944.

"We have endeavored to obtain information about our brother and others who are missing. ***"

3. The captured German records contain no information relative to the subject persons or their tank, nor do the files of the Memorial Division, Office of the Quartermaster General contain any burial information, at the present, on them.

4. The subject persons were members of the crew of a tank of Company C, 40th Tank Battalion, whose mission on 9 September 1944 was to destroy the enemy and their gun emplacements. While attacking the enemy near Mannville, France the tank was hit by enemy fire and burned. Subsequent searches in the vicinity where these men became missing failed to reveal any trace of them. The captured German records contain no information of any of the crew or the tank. Nothing has been seen or heard of them since. Considering the above facts and the lapse of time it is reasonable to believe that they were killed and their remains destroyed by the fire and explosions of ammunition in the tank.

5. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death stating that the personnel named in paragraph one, above, Infantry, were killed in action, not in flying or jump pay status, on 9 September 1944 near Mannville, France. The official report of death will include the following statement:

"Finding of Death has been issued previously under Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, showing presumed date of death as 10 September 1945. This 'Report of Death' is issued in accordance with Section 9 of said Act and its effect on prior payments and settlements is as provided in Section 9."



1. After a complete investigation and search in the area of Manonville and Martincourt, no positive information was obtained regarding the five deceased enlisted men.

2. The investigation revealed that no combat took place in Manonville or Martincourt, as the enemy had retreated prior to the arrival of American troops in the area. Individuals questioned stated that no Americans were ever buried in their community.

CERTIFICATE

I the undersigned Edouard d'Hamonville, declare having been at Manonville during the departure of the last German troops and upon the arrival of the first Americans. I certify that the Germans left Manonville on Sunday, 13 September 1944, at about 3 AM, their orders having been given the night before by their General Staff at Dienlonard to withdraw to the other side of the Moselle (the right bank).

It was only the 4th of September when some American Jeeps guided by members of the Maquis passed through the village. The Maquis from the forest of Puvenelle held the banks of the Moselle in the region of Pont a Mousson, and it is probable that no combat took place between the American and Germans, between Manonville and Pont a Mousson. Some combat took place in the region of Rosiers and Sargerais where the Germans held a bridgehead on the Marbach side.

DECLARATION

The Mayor of the Commune of Martincourt residing at Manonville after the partial destruction of Martincourt declares that the morning of 4 September 1944 finding himself at Manonville he accompanied and guided to Martincourt the first elements of the American Army coming from the general direction of Commercy.

As far as he knows no engagement took place on the territory of the Commune of Martincourt between the American Army and the Germans.

An American ambulance was installed in a field of the Chateau of Pierrefort, alongside of a stream. Many wounded coming from the engagements on the banks of the Moselle were brought there and treated. No American soldiers was buried in the region of the Commune of Martincourt nor that of Manonville.

Therefore I can furnish no information concerning the American soldiers bearing the following names:

Interview Secretary to Mayor, M Lemoy, who states that there have been no remains or isolated burials of any U. S. deceased discovered or reported in his community since last investigation on 29 May 1947, and adds that no American soldiers were killed or wounded in his territory, as there had never been any combat between the Americans and Germans. This was the unanimous opinion of those questioned in Manonville.

At Martingourt:

Interview the Mayor, and the Mayor's Secretary, and Mr & Mrs Mathiot, who state that no combat had taken place either in Manonville or Martincourt, as German military had retreated from the area before the arrival of U.S. troops, and that no American soldiers had been killed or buried in the territory of the commune. Could give no information regarding Sgt Bryan and the four other EM presumed killed in this area. Also interviewed M. Valet, of Martincourt, who could give me no information regarding subject deceased. As no other information was available we left area at 1630 hours and arrived Nancy 1730 hours.

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
