SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground operations in the department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, France, from the period 7 September through 3 December 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Meurthe-et-Moselle, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Meurthe-et-Moselle department, consists of farm, pasture and forest land which has been under constant use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification, with the exception of two men listed on attached roster who were known to have drowned and their remains never recovered. absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed on these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

1. The following persons, Infantry, members of Company C, 40th Tank Battalion were reported missing in action, not in flying or jump pay status, in France on 9 September 1944 by ETO Shipment Number 196 and presumed dead as of 10 September 1945 under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act (SR&D Case Number 4036):

2. A Missing Report, dated 10 September 1944, filed in the AG 201 file of Sergeant Bryan contains the following information:

Mission: "To destroy enemy and gun emplacements."

Point of Departure: "3 Miles S.W. Malancourt". Date: "9 Sep 1944."

Intended Destination: "Mannville, France."

Last Known Whereabouts: "Near Mannville, France."

Circumstances Surrounding Disappearance: "In attacking, the tank in which the above man was riding, was hit by enemy fire and burned.

He has not shown up or been reported by any Med Aid Station."

The report further shows that there were no eyewitnesses and search was not made as territory was in enemy hands.

- a. Similar Missing Reports are filed in the AG 201 and Casualty Section files of the other four members of the subject tank crew.
- b. A "Certificate" of search, dated 16 September 1944, signed by 1st Lt Hilton J. Dentser, Company C, 40th Tank Battalion, found in Sergeant Jack H. Lewis' Casualty Section file, certifies that information received from persons "in the vicinity where the above soldier was missing in action makes me believe his personal effects were destroyed by fire or captured by the enemy."
- c. Copy of a letter, dated 23 April 1945, from Captain Robert M. Rutan, Chaplain, 40th Tank Battalion, to Mr. Jim Wallace, brother of Private First Class Florian Wallace, one of the subject persons, found in his Casualty Section file shows that:

"During the bitter fighting in the vicinity of Metz, France, your brother's tank was disabled while in action. Florian did not 4 1950 appear with the other members of his company and was listed as missing in action on the 9th of September, 1944.

"We have ended red to obtain information about our brother and others who are missing. \*\*\*"

- 3. The captured German records contain no information relative to the subject persons or their tank, nor do the files of the Memorial Division, Office of the Quartermaster General contain any burial information, at the present, on them.
- 4. The subject persons were members of the crew of a tank of Company C, 40th Tank Battalion, whose mission on 9 September 1944 was to destroy the enemy and their gun emplacements. While attacking the enemy near Mannville, France the tank was hit by enemy fire and burned. Subsequent searches in the vicinity where these men became missing failed to reveal any trace of them. The captured German records contain no information of any of the crew or the tank. Nothing has been seen or heard of them since. Considering the above facts and the lapse of time it is reasonable to believe that they were killed and their remains destroyed by the fire and explosions of ammunition in the tank.
- 5. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death stating that the personnel named in paragraph one, above, Infantry, were killed in action, not in flying or jump pay status, on 9 September 1944 near Mannville, France. The official report of death will include the following statement:

"Finding of Death has been issued previously under Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, showing presumed date of death as 10 September 1945. This 'Report of Death' is issued in accordance with Section 9 of said Act and its effect on prior payments and settlements is as provided in Section 9."

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Lewis:

Since your son, Sergeant, Jack H. Lewis, 32,253,215 Armored Force, was reported missing in action 9 September 1944, the War Department has entertained the hope that he survived and that information would be revealed dispelling the uncertainty surrounding his absence. However, as in many cases, the conditions of warfare deny us such information. The record concerning your son shows thathe was aborad a tank that was hit by enemy fire and burned while attacking in the vicinity of Malancourt, France.

Full consideration has recently been given to all available information bearing on the absence of your son, including all records, reports and circumstances. These have been carefully reviewed and considered. In view of the fact that twelve months have now expired without the receipt of evidence to support a continued presumption of survival, the War Department must terminate such absence by a presumptive finding of death. Accordingly, an official finding of death has been recorded under the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, approved March 7, 1942, as amended.

The finding does not establish an actual or probable date of death; however, as required by law, it includes a presumptive date of death for the termination of pay and allowances, settlement of accounts and payment of death gratuities. In the case of your son this date has been set as 10 September 1945, the day following the expiration of twelve months, absence.

I regret the necessity for this message but trust that the ending of a long period of uncertainty may give at least some small measure of consolation. I hope you may find sustaining comfort in the thought that the uncertainty with which war has surrounded the absence of your son has enhanced the honor of his service to his country and of his sacrifice.
