

1. a. The Inspection Team from Headquarters Army Ground Forces which conducted the recent inspection of vehicles, weapons, signal equipment, and records pertaining thereto, reported to the Commanding General that, throughout the units inspected, all were found to be in an excellent or superior condition. It is believed that conditions found in the units inspected represent a cross-section of the status of maintenance throughout the Division.

b. This report is gratifying to the Commanding General who realizes that it is the result of effort and cooperation by all concerned in carrying out daily the Division Maintenance Policy.

2. The standard obtained is high. This high standard must be maintained. Continued cooperation and determined effort, and compliance with the Division Policy, is enjoined upon all concerned.

3. Division spot-check teams will continue to operate, and unit commanders may operate such additional teams as they desire. Shop procedure will continue to have command supervision; judicious supervision and use of spare parts will continue to be a command function in all echelons. Driver training and examination must be continuous. First and second echelon maintenance are primary requisites for superior maintenance.

4. a. Beginning Monday, 31 January 1944, the extra parks period prescribed by Administrative Memorandum No. 3, this headquarters, c.s., for vehicles found deficient during the preceding week will continue with the following modification:

The deficient vehicle with driver and assistant driver (or in case of crew operated vehicle, the entire crew) will be required to stand extra parks under the supervision of the company motor officer, company commander, battalion commander, and such additional personnel as the company or battalion commander may require.

b. Any noticeable decline in the maintenance standard reflected by spot check inspections will cause a revocation of the above sub-paragraph and immediate reestablishment of "extra parks" for the entire organization concerned.

5. This order will be read to the command at the next formation and published on the bulletin board for a period of forty-eight hours.
