Remarks : This body consists of a complete skeleton, except for bones of hands and feet which are missing, skull crushed but teeth are present. Bones are large and heavy. Particularly unusual was the stermum, a very large manubrium; and its overall length almost half again size of normal man. Approx.weight of remains 35 lbs. No flesh at all with skeleton. One Identification Tag found with remains / impression below. Clothing marks found on raincoat and jacket ans helmet and do not agree with serial number on Identification Tag.
