



LUND, ARNOID L., 2d Lt., 01017316, MTA 6 August 1944.

Officer was last seen at Aron, France, (near Mayenne), 6 August 1944. At the time this officer became MIA, he was a Medium Tank Platoon Leader, riding in the lead tank. Lt. Lund's tank was knocked out several hundred yards in front of friendly lines. Lt. Lund evacuated the burning tank and was last seen lying on the ground near the tank, where the Medics rendered 1st Aid to him, but were unable to evacuate the officer to friendly lines due to heavy enemy MG crossfire. The Battalion Motor Officer managed to crawl close enough to talk to Lt. Lund while he was lying on the ground. Our troops were forced to with-draw and use another route on the march to Le-Mans, and from all information, they never reached the point where officer was wounded, at that time. He is believed to have been picked up by German Medics.

BOWERS, PERCY E., T/4, 36201884, crew member (driver) of Lt. Lund's tank was KIA. The remaining three crew members were all evacuated with severe burns.

HOWELL, RICHARD C., Pvt., 38336612, MIA 3 July 1944.

Last seen 2 mile SE St. Jores, France, 3 July 1944. At time soldier became MIA, he was a gunner in Medium Tank W-30103813, (Hq. #44). Tank was hit by an enemy tank gun and immediately caught fire. Pvt Howell was seen to evacuate tank and begin running through field toward friendly lines. This is the last time soldier was seen, and no further information has been located regarding him. The remaining four crew member were all evacuated with severe burns.

TITMAN, KENNETH E., Sgt., 6563293, MIA 11 July 1944.

Last seen 1 mile South Le Haye de Puits, France, 11 July 1944. At time soldier became MIA, he was Tank Commander of Medium Tank No. W-3033594. This tank was knocked out of action at Foret du Monte Castre, France, (base of hill No. 122), on night of 11 July 1944, by what is believed to have been an enemy anti-tank gun. At time tank was knocked out, the enemy was counter-attacking and succeeded in retaking position where tank was knocked out, making it impossible for friendly troops to approach the burned tank until ground was regained approximately three days later. Tank was burned and all the ammunition had exploded. Sgt Titman was not seen to evacuate the tank, but no means of identification could be found belonging to soldier.

COHRON, KENNETH R., Cpl., 33443588, crew member, (gunner), in Sgt Titman's tank was KIA at this time.

WOJTILLA, STEPHEN J., Pfc, 31197174, MIA 11 July 1944.

Last seen ½ mile South Le Haye de Puits, France, 11 July 1944. Pfc Wojtilla was crew member, (loader), in Sgt Titman's tank, at time he became MIA. He was not seen to evacuate tank and no means of identification could be found belonging to soldier.



GENTLE, HAROLD A., Cpl., 33468250, MIA 11 July 1944.

Last seen ½ mile South Le Haye de Puits, France, 11 July 1944. At time soldier became MIA, he was gunner in Medium Tank #3038774. This tank was knocked out at Foret du Monte Castre, France, (base of hill No. 122), the night of 11 July 1944, by what is believed to have been an enemy anti-tank gun. At time tank was knocked out, the enemy was counter-attacking and succeeded in retaking the position where tank was knocked out, making it impossible for friendly troops to approach the burned tank until ground was regained, approximately three days later. Cpl Gentle was not seen to evacuate tank. No means of identification could be found belonging to soldier.



This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 
