



1. Subject soldier was one of a number of American dead buried by the enemy in a common grave in a small Normandy village church cemetery.

2. During this Regiment's operations in the sector, the grave was called to the attention of the undersigned in his capacity as Regimental Graves Registration Officer.

3. The parish priest was contacted and he gave the undersigned a list of the names of the men buried there. The source of the priest's information is unknown, except that he has in his possession the identification tags of several of the deceased.

4. All the information obtained was incorporated in the letter to which reference is made in preceding 3rd Indorsement. No attempt was made in the letter at individual identification and it was suggested that the priest be contacted to assist in such identification when disinterment was accomplished.

5. The soldier was not a member of this command. From conversation with the priest, who spoke English only slightly, the impression was obtained that all the men were paratroopers. To the knowledge of the undersigned, the 82nd Division was the nearest airborne unit to operate in that sector. There is every probability that the name spelling may have been incorrect.





This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). 

Teeth are average size and a dull white color. Teeth are straight and well aligned except for R 9 of which the lingual surface overlaps the facial surface of L 9 about 1/16 of an inch. The facial surface of R 7 is rotated mesially about 1/8 of a turn.

R 3 and 4 both appear to have been extracted as does L 13 and 14 and L 14.

There is a space of 1/16 of an inch between R 3 and R 4, R 4 and R 5, and L 3 and L 4. There is a 1/8 of an inch space between R 5 and R 7.
