





RESULTS OF EXAMINATIONS

An examination of the man's signet ring, specimen Q58, revealed the crudely inscribed initials "F F " or "F F " on its face. The examiner believes that it is more probable that the initials are "F K " than "F F " It was not possible to establish the origin of the ring

The signet ling is made from three pieces of metal. The initialled face of the ring is a flat piece of white metal which is fastened to a larger similarly shaped piece of brass. These two ring components are then soldered to a brass ring band. The white metal top, the larger similarly shaped piece of brass and the brass ring band constitute the three thicknesses of metal in the center of the ring. The precise shape and design of these ring components may be seen by referring to the enclosed photographs. The examiner believes the ring is a very inexpensive one and crudely made. It is entirely possible that this ring may be "home made"

The band of the ring on specimen Q58 is very unusual in that it contains the fragmentary inscription of what appears to be "CHAMBRES DE COLATROE DE IRANCE". There are no other inscriptions on the inside of the band. It appears that the band is made from some product made for the Chamber of Commerce of France and then adapted for use on this particular ring. The ring size of specimen Q58 is approximately $10\frac{1}{2}$ It certainly appears that this ring is of foreign origin

In addition to the regular photographs which we submit to your office in this type of case, a photograph showing a small portion of the inscription on the inside of the band is also being enclosed. All of the photographs in this report are twice the actual size of the objects photographed

It was not possible to determine the origin of the mar's souvenir ring, specimen Q59. The face of the ring contains the inscribed legend "APZIO 1944". This ring is size $9\frac{1}{2}$ and contains no other identifying information. The ring itself is brass which has been plated with a white metal which would tend to indicate it is not "home made".

Dear Mr Kornegay

An investigation is being conducted by this office to determine, if possible, the identity of an Unknown American Serviceman, who was killed approximately 7 January 1945 in the vicinity of Wingen-sur-Moder, i France

Found on these remains were two rings, one which bore the initials "J F K " and the other marked "Anzio-1944"

In view of the fact that War Department Records listed you as Missing in Action on 2 January 1945 in that area, and you were supposed to have had two rings marked in this manner, it would be of the utmost value if you could inform this office as to where you may have lost these rings or to whom you may have given them for safe keeping

It is further requested that you give the name, rank and the Army Serial Numbers, if possible, of the members of your Squad, all of whom disappeared about 2100 hours on 2 January 1945 in the same vicinity

Company was receiving fire from all sides at once and personnel withdrew south and established a new line 500 yards behind the old one Most of the company escaped from the trap. With the daylight and reorganization Pvt Kornegay was discovered missing.


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
SKELETAL CHART

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
