SUBJECT: Identification of Deceased Personnel.

TO : Commanding General, 5th Inf Div, APO 5, U. S. Army.

1. The remains of a man, believed to have been a member of your command, were buried as Unknown X-22 in U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, Limey, France, on 18 December 1944. The place of death is shown on the attached copy of report of burial.

2. The remains of Howard O. Sogge, 36227607, KIA as of 8 Sep 44, Charles S. Orne, O-482174, KIA as of 8 Sep 44, Ivey Walker, 34089063, KIA as of 9 Sep 44 and Charles Serneck, 36018843, MIA as of 11 Sep 44, were found in the same location as this unknown. Battle Casualty records disclose that these men were assigned to the 11th Inf Regt. According to this information, Unknown X-22 appears to have been a member of the same regiment and to have been killed on Sep 8th or 9th.

3. Your attention is called to the "Check List" attached to the Burial Report, revealing that an M-1 Rifle No. 256618, was found under the remains. This number should be checked against Forms 32 of all men killed and missing in action during the period from the 8th to the 11th of September, inclusive. Upon determining the name of the man to whom the rifle was issued, all the details and facts furnished on the report of burial should be closely compared for any similarity of physical description and the clothing worn.

4. The size of shoe "9EE", worn by the deceased, is also called to your attention, as it is an important clue in establishing identification of this unknown.

5. The following list of names were reported by the 11th Inf Regt as KIA on the 8th and 9th of September 1944, but no reports of burial have been received by this headquarters. These names are furnished with the belief that they may help, through a process of elimination, to establish the identity of Unknown X-22:

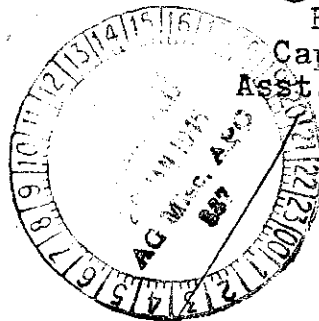



1. Disinterment of Unknown X-22 revealed a wire splint, about 31 inches long, believed to have been affixed to the left leg which appeared to have been fractured just below the knee. This splint indicates treatment by medical personnel but so far as is known the body was not picked up at a medical unit.

2. Clothing examined and following noted. German type field jacket, estimated medium size; G.I. field jacket estimated 38R; O.D. trousers, W36-L31; O.D. shirt, 15 1/2 X 33; O.D. summer undershirt, size 38; O.D. summer cotton drawers, estimated size 36; O.D. socks, size 11; G.I. shoes, size 9 EE.

SUBJECT: Identification of Deceased Personnel

TO : Commanding Officer, 11th Infantry.

1. Have been unable to establish any positive identification of Unknown X-22, buried in U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, Limay, France on 18 December 1944.

2. Have found the names of three men that it is possible Unknown X-22 may be.

AUGUST H. GRANTE, 15964759, Pfc, Co "F", 11th Inf, reported MIA on 10 September 1944.

CORLIAND BAYLES, 36227795, Sgt, Co "F", 11th Inf, reported MIA on 10 September 1944.

BASCOM H. TABOR, 5980947, Pfc, Co "H", 11th Inf, reported MIA on 11 September 1944.

3. Description of Investigation.

Contacted Major Ferris A. Church, Executive Officer of 2d Bn, 11th Infantry and Captain Wilbur N. Moon, Commanding Officer, Headquarters Company, 2d Bn, 11th Infantry. After giving description they stated that it might be Sgt. Grante.

Contacted Captain Jack M. Brown, CO Co "F", 11th Infantry. No opinion as to identification of unknown. He called together four squad leaders and the supply sergeant of Co "F", only remaining personnel who were present at the action and went over details with them for identification. The personal effects were of no assistance. The sergeants stated that both Grante and Bayles fitted - regarding color of hair. The estimated physical characteristics came closer to Grante than Bayles. Stated that they knew that Bayles had fractured leg. Of the three front teeth reported believed knocked out, they stated that Grante had a partial plate that they thought contained the same teeth. The number of the rifle is not on their records and the shoe size is shown to have been worn by three men, all of whom are present for duty.

Checked with 1st Sgt and Supply Sgt of Co "H", 11th Inf. They stated that color of hair and estimated physical characteristics might fit Tabor. Tabor was armed with a carbine, however, no way to check shoe size.

Checked with Captain Clarence W. Sawyer and Captain Andrew R. Loban, Regimental Dental Surgeons. Medical records of Dental Surgeons are from 1 July 1944 to date and show that none of these three men have had any work done. Records of Dental work done before 1 July 1944 were stored with effects of before departure for combat.

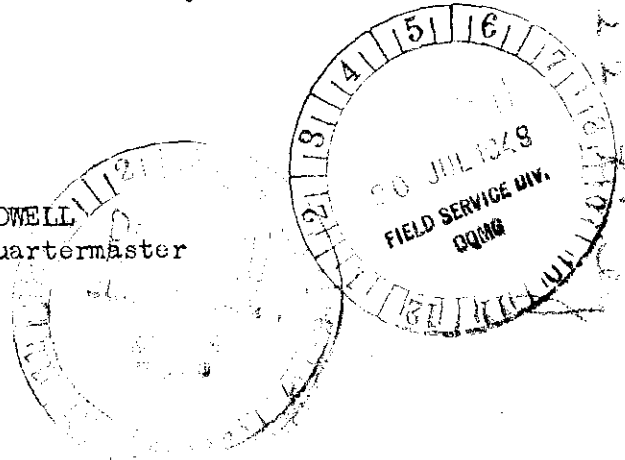

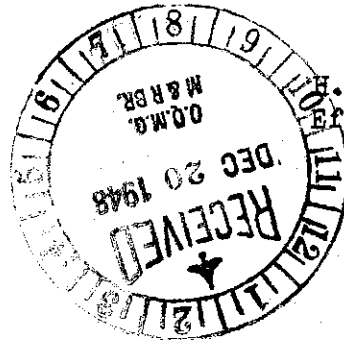

UNKNOWN NO. X-22 U.S. MILITARY CEMETERY Limey, France
 (Location)

X-22 Limey, was recovered from the roadside about one kilometer from Corny, (Moselle) France, between that community and Jouy Aux Arches. A number of other casualties found in the immediate area bore Emergency Medical Tags and the organizations of these casualties were checked, notably the 11th Infantry, for a possible identification as a member of one of those organizations. Other remains were identified by identification tags found on the remains.

An examination of the remains disclosed a wire splint on the left leg indicating emergency medical care, however no EMTag accompanied the remains. No other means of identification could be found.

Attempted association was negative, therefore: UNIDENTIFIABLE.

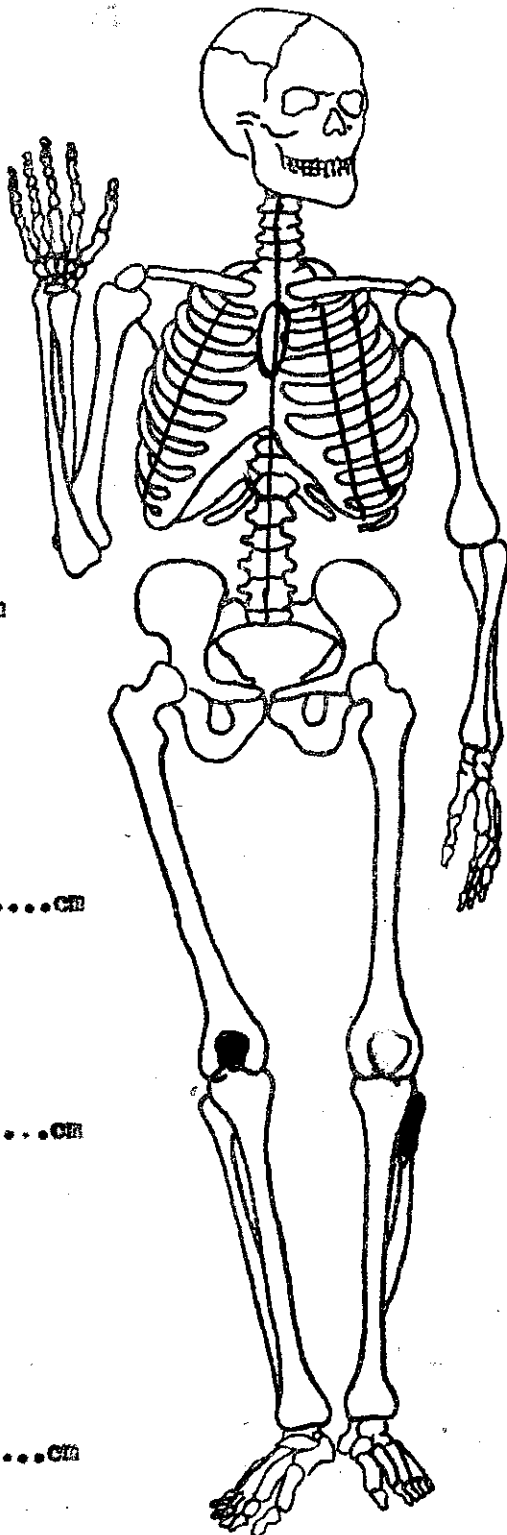
