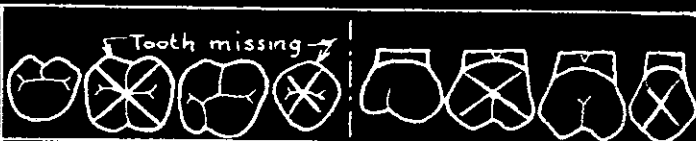


This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning from the mid-line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on each side and classified as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), premolars (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings checked to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, dentures, filling, caries (traces of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaw. 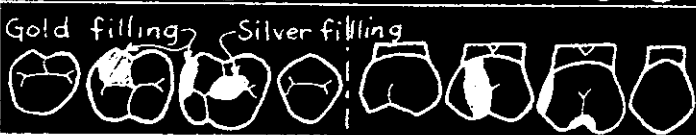

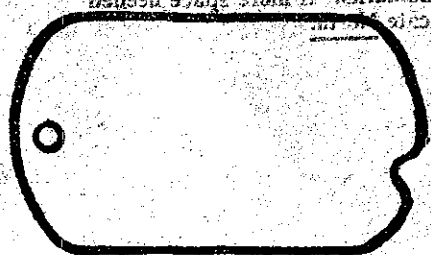
