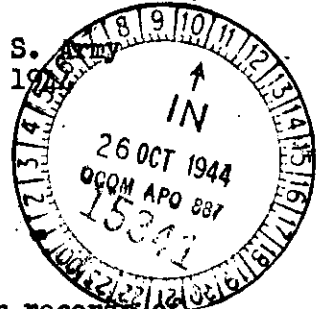

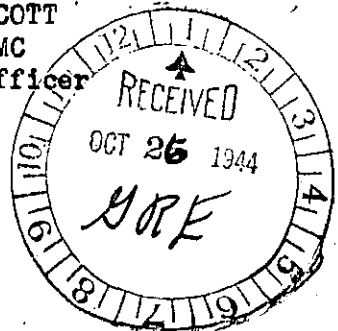

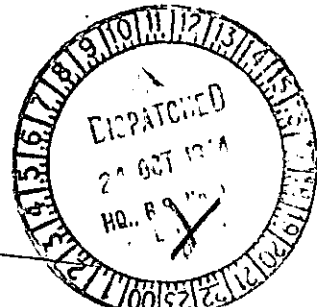

1. This headquarters has never received a Burial Report indicating that the remains of subject individual have been buried in an isolated grave or an established U. S. Military Cemetery in this theater.

5. Can friends of the deceased and the Supply Sgt of his organization furnish from memory, or from available records, the approximate height, weight, color of eyes and hair, clothing size's, shoe size, marital status, or some unusual characteristics of the deceased, which might help to establish his remains as one of the Unknowns buried in U. S. Military Cemeteries?

3. Any additional information which may help to recover the remains of the deceased should be forwarded to this headquarters.

SUBJECT: 2nd Lt Arthur J Grossman

TO : Commanding General, 6th Armored Division

On 4 August 1944 while reconnoitering ford across Oust river approximately 1000 yards west of St Caradec, France, 2d Lt Arthur J Grossman, 01031609, Troop "E", 86th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron Mechanized was killed by the explosion of teller mines on the bank of the Oust river. I saw the body and identified same as that of Lt Grossman. His body was blown to pieces and pulled from the river by the F.F.I. The F.F.I. evacuated the body to St Caradec (145679) and buried in the F.F.I. Cemetary at St Caradec.

One identification tag was left with the body, grave is clearly marked by cross bearing name and date killed.

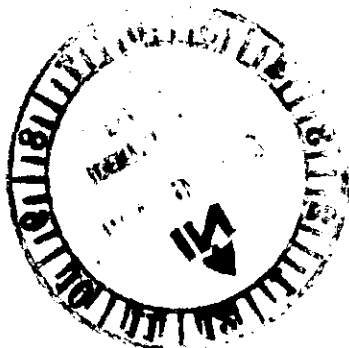

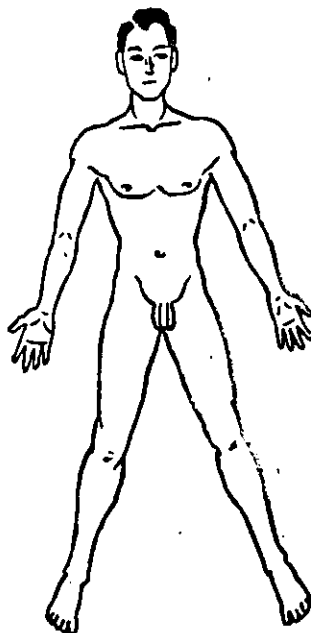

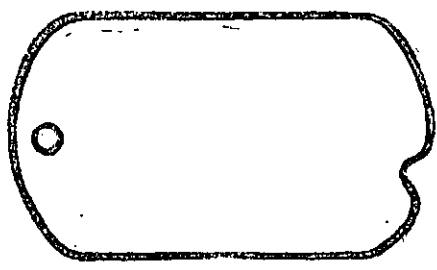
