- 1. Reference, unumbered Memorandum dated 12 September 1944; the following additional information has been obtained on the subject unknown bodies:
- 2. A slip of paper has been recovered from The Hopital Cemetiere, Epernay, Coord: 2456, Epernay Map, Sheet 12/F/3, scale 1/150,000. On this paper is the following information written in pencil:
 - SOLDATS AMERICAINS
 - 1. Virgil Stephens
 - 2. X
 - 3. X 4. Machael Holtz
 - 5. Charles Kos
- 3. The two bodies listed as (X) have been reinterred in U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, Champigneul, France, and marked as Unknown X-7 and Unknown X-8.
- 4. It has been established that the men designated as Unknown X-7 and Unknown X-8 were burned beyond recognition when their tank was set fire by German action. A canvas of the town of Epernay has established that the tank burned at a point exactly .5 miles from the two circle on Route N3 to Paris. A further canvas of the immediate neighborhood established the following:
 - a. Date of action, 28 August 1944.
 - b. Time of action, 1530 hours.
 - c. At least two (2) men of the tank crew survived.
 - d. One (1) survivor ran into the residence of Mme. Mauclair, No. 4 Rue Blandin, Epernay, who has a picture of this man.

 e. This survivor have his name as T/5 Henry Bruzdowski, or Henry

 - f. He gave his unit as Co. C, 31st Tank Bn., APO 257.
 - g. He gave his home address as 33 Cumming St., Hoosick Falls, N. Y.
 - h. The tank exploded and burned all night.
 - i. Two (2) civilians were killed in the explosion of the Tank while attempting to aid the men inside the tank.

: Chief, Graves Registration and Effects Division, Office of the Chief Quartermaster, APO 887-A, U. S. Army.

1. Captain Alvin F. Davis, 0-362062, was reported KIA 28 August 1944 by the 31st Tank Battalion. No Report of Burial is on file in this Headquarters for Captain Davis. His specification serial number was that of a Tank Unit Commander.

2. An examination of clothing found on the remains buried 7 Sept 1944 in U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, Champigneul, France, as Unknown X-8 disclosed that the trousers were marked with the name and serial number of Captain Davis. Iknown X-8 and two other members of the 31st Tank Battalion who were reported KIA on the same day as Captain Davis were disinterred in a civilian cemetery at Epernay, France, and reburied in the cemetery at Champigneul. The Report of Burial states that Unknown X-8 was burned in a tank.

The remains of Unknown X-8 were recovered from a tank in the vicinity of Epernay, France; estimated date of death, 31 August 1944. This is in agreement with Army records for Capt Alvin F. DAVIS, 0-362602, 31st Tank Bn. as to place, cause and date of death.

Original identification of Unknown X-8 as Capt. DAVIS was established by name and ASN found in waistband of trousers worn by the remains. (See C/L for Disinterments)

In view of the lack of further identifying data, and doubt as to proper identity expressed in previous investigations (see letter, Hqrs, 7th Armored Division, dated 15 May 1945, signed by 2/Lt. Max Zaidenberg), the Field was requested to reinvestigate the case and submit Field Board findings.

Favorable comparison of tooth chart accomplished upon reprocessing, with Army dental records for Capt. DAVIS substantiates the identification as originally established.

Note: Army dental records for the only other unidentified deceased of the 31st Tank Bn. KIA or MIA on the same date (as listed by AGO Casualty Records), compare negatively with tooth chart for Unknown X-8. Tooth chart for the only other unknown recovered from Epernay, France (Unknown X-7, Champigneul) compares negatively with dental records for Capt. DAVIS. (See dental comparison pharts)

- 1. Attention is invited to corrected copy of Report of Burial in connection with Captain Alvin F. Davis, 0 352 062, former member of 31st Tank Battalion, an element of this command, and to original Report of Burial in the case of Unknown X-8. (See Inclosures Nos. 1
- 2. It is the opinion of this headquarters that Unknown X-8 and Captain Alvin F. Davis are not one and the same person, this opinion being based upon the following facts:
- a. Captain Davis was reported originally as being "MIA", in France, as of 28 August 1944, on Battle Casualty Report No. 20, Headquarters 31st Tank Battalion, dated 12 September 1944, and theretle Casualty Report No. 30, of that headquarters, dated 22 September 1944.
- b. The change of casualty status in the case of subject officer was based upon signed certificates, true copies of which are herewith attached and designated as Inclosures Nos. 3 and 4.
- c. Certificates referred to in paragraph b, above, indicate that Captain Davis, positively identified, was left unburied, due to tactical situation, in a cafe in Epernay, France, and that the location of his remains was furnished to an unknown burial and graves registration organization, then situated in Epernay or its vicinity.
- d. Report of Burial in the case of Captain Davis indicates that identification is based on markings on trousers and shirt, whereas Report of Burial in the case of Unknown X-8 states that no identifying marks for said individual were available.
- e. Report of Burial in the case of Unknown X-8 and supplemental information sheet (Inclosure No. 5) indicates that Unknown X-8 was a member of a tank crew which tank burned at a spot exactly .5 miles from the town circle on Route N-3 to Paris, whereas the remains of Captain Davis were left as indicated above.
- f. Supplemental information sheet avers that Unknown X-8 was a member of the crew of which Tec 5 Bruzdowski was likewise a

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member. Captain Davis was not a member of that crew.

- 3. This headquarters is currently investigating the facts and circumstances surrounding the disappearance of Bruzdowski's crew, with a view towards identifying Unknown X-7 and Unknown X-8, and has reached a tentative conclusion that Unknown X-7 and Unknown X-8 are either 2d Lt Donald J. Shaljian, Ol Ol7 O63, Cpl Frank L. Ensminger, 33 148 547, or Pfc John F. Tucker, 38 516 495, who are carried on the rolls of the 31st Tank Battalion as being "MIA", in France, as of 28 August 1944.
- 4. In view of the foregoing it is recommended that the identification of Unknown X-8 be left open until such time as further evidence in connection therewith can be secured.

At that time I was a member of Company "C", 31st Tank Battalion, 7 Armed Division.

On August 28 1944 my tank was hit and burned in a small tewn in France. I, who was driging at the time and the assistant driver whose name was T/4 Henry Br Brokewski were the only enes who I saw get out of our tank.

The tank commander was a 2nd Lt. who joined us a day or two before. I do not recall his name. The gunners name was Cpl. Enninger. The radio operator was a replacement who came in the day before and I don't recall his name either.

At or around 1800 hrs on the 28 August 1944 we came upon this small town in France and started to enter it. My tank was the lead tank and we just entered the town when we were hit. A bezoeka shell hit us and went into the turrent. I turned around and saw all flames and I yelled to the other driver to get out. As we both get out another shell hit where we were sitting. I ran to one side of the street and the other driver ran to the other.

The 2nd tank in the column passed us and I jumped on the back of it. I don't know what happened to the other driver. I rode the back of the second tank until we came to the other end of town where that tank was hit. All six of us got out of that tank and were laying in a ditch without any guns when a German patrol came along and captured us.

We were taken behind the lines and later taken to Augsburg Germany where we stayed till the end of the war.

I am sorry I can't furnish any further information. I'll be at your services in case I am needed further.



A canvas of the town of Epernay has established that the tank burned at a point exactly .5 miles from the two circle on Route N3 to Paris. A further canvas of the immediate neighborhood established the following:

a. Date of action, 28 August 1944.
b. Time of action, 1530 hours
c. At least two (2) men of the tank crew survived.

d. One (1) survivor ran into the residence of Mme. Mauclair, No. 4 Rue Blandin, Epernay, who has a picuture of this man.

e. This survivor gave his name as T/5 Henry Bruzdowski, or Henry Boizdowski.

f. He gave his unit as Co. C, 31st Tank Bn, APO 257.

g. He gave his home address as 33 Cumming St. Hoosick Falls, N.Y.

The tank exploded and burned all night.

i. Two (2) civilians were killed in the explosion of the Tank while attempting to aid the men inside the tank.
