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

- 1. When the remains are delivered for interment in a civilian or private cemetery, you are responsible for paying all interment expenses. In this connection, you are entitled to the allowance mentioned in paragraph 2 below.
- 2. An amount not to exceed \$75 is allowed by the Government toward actual interment expenses when final interment of the remains is in a private or civilian cemetery. No allowance is authorized toward interment expenses when interment is in a national or post cemetery.
- 3. The \$75 maximum allowance by the Government toward interment expenses includes but is not limited to the payment of one or more of the following items: Hearse hire from the railroad station to your home, the funeral home, church, cemetery, or any other place designated by you; vault; church services; newspaper notices; transportation for friends and relatives to and from cemetery; and the services of a funeral director.

Dear Mrs. Grady:

Your letter pertaining to the remains of your son, the late Private First Class William H. Grady Jr., has been brought to my attention.

The official report of burial indicates that the remains of your son were originally interred in Breuna, Germany, but were later disinterred and moved to a more appropriate location where constant care and protection could be given our honored dead.

The remains of your son are now properly interred in Plot KK, Row 8, Grave 188 in the United States Military Cemetery Margraten, Holland, located ten miles west of Aachen, Germany.

The "Request for Disposition of Remains" forms regarding this cemetery have not yet been mailed to the next of kin of those heroic dead.

The Return of World War II Dead Program provides for the return of the deceased to their next of kin in a predetermined scheduled sequence of the cemeteries in which they are now buried. Efficient and rapid accomplishment of this tremendous program requires not only close adherence to mailing schedules for the Disposition Forms made in agreement with the scheduled cemetery sequence, but also accurate verification of all vital records of every decedent prior to the mailing of the Disposition Form. When verification for each cemetery is completed, the forms are mailed well in advance of the scheduled processing of the cemetery.

The present schedule for the return of the remains of your son indicates that they may be delivered during the fall of 1948. You will understand I am sure, that unforeseen and unpreventable circumstances may disrupt the Return Program, thereby delaying this estimated date. A more definite date for the return of his remains will be transmitted later, but sufficiently in advance to permit such funeral and personal arrangements as may be desired.





Reference is made to your inquiry in behalf of Mr. William H. Grady, R.F.D. 1, Middletown, Indiana, who desires information regarding the burial and return of the remains of his son, Private First Class William H. Grady, Jr., who was killed in action.

It is regretted that a burial report for Private Grady has not, as yet, been received in this office. However, an effort is being made to obtain that report, and upon its receipt, you will be further informed.

Mr. Grady may be informed that, at the beginning of the war, it became necessary to adopt the policy that the remains of our military personnel who die outside the continental limits of the United States be interred locally until cessation of hostilities in all Theaters of Operation.

Until the report of interment is received, this office is unable to assure Mr. Grady that it will be possible to return the remains of her son to the United States for final interment. However, a notation has been made on the official records of this office that it is his desire that the remains of his son be returned to this country, if possible, for a final resting place after the war.

A copy of your inquiry has been forwarded to the Office Chief of Chaplains, Army Service Forces, Washington, D. C., for direct reply regarding the name of the Chaplain who officiated at the final rites.
